INTRODUCTION: Needless to say, the pandemic of the past two years has impacted the entire world. These unprecedented times have been challenging on many levels, including the limits placed on our ability to travel freely and safely. On a positive note, perhaps we have been reminded of the pleasure found in simple activities such as going for a walk and talking with our "socially distanced" neighbours. For most of us however, there remains a deep-rooted desire to explore new places. Now, with rising vaccination rates and clearly defined rules in place, people are beginning to act on that desire. Although personal comfort levels will vary, interest in travel is definitely on the rise. From our perspective as trip organizers, the challenges of planning tours have definitely increased. All potential destinations must be vetted with safety considerations and government regulations in mind. For these reasons, Canada will be our primary focus in 2022. Our first trip will be to Nova Scotia in late June, with a resort stay in Cape Breton, a drive around the scenic Cabot Trail and a three night-stay in Halifax, featuring the world-famous Nova Scotia International Tattoo and Canada Day celebrations. Our annual nine-day trek to Newfoundland in early July (for the 21st time), features three boat tours, local entertainment, great food and beautiful scenery. We are also excited to offer (for the first time), an eight-day "Newfoundland Revisited" tour in late August. Although it excludes the Western Peninsula, it does feature several Gros Morne National Park highlights and includes a day-trip to Fogo Island with a local guide. We hope this trip appeals to those who wish to return to NL for something a bit different. Our exception to Canadian destinations will be a thirteenday tour of Portugal, beginning in late September. It includes ten UNESCO World Heritage Sites, picturesque scenery and mouth-watering cuisine. All prices are in Canadian dollars and include HST on Canadian trips, while tours outside the country are tax exempt. Included meals are denoted with a letter at the end of each day's description (B/L/D). Please adhere to the deposit and cut-off dates listed (these are mandated by suppliers), and use a separate registration form for each tour you join. Each trip is carefully planned with all the important details looked after; all you need to do is relax and enjoy yourself. We hope to have the pleasure of travelling with you in the near future! <u>CAPE BRETON, THE TATTOO & CANADA DAY IN HALIFAX</u>: June 27 - July 2, 2022 Escorts: Earl Clint & John Swatridge

June 27 Our morning flight departs from Pearson in Toronto. Upon arrival in Halifax, we will drive north to Cape Breton and check into an historic lodge on the shores of Bras d'Or Lake. (-/-/D) Accommodation: Inverary Resort, Baddeck, NS (2 nights).

June 28 Today we will drive the world-famous Cabot Trail with several stops to take in the panoramic views of the rugged coastline within Cape Breton Highlands National Park. We return to the hotel for some free time to wander the lakefront grounds before dinner. Some local music will be provided in the evening. (B/L/D)

June 29 This morning we will visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum, where you will no doubt be impressed by the scope of his inventions. Bell spent his summers here because it reminded him of his native Scotland. We will then enjoy a scenic drive to Halifax with a few stops along the way. **(B/-/-) Accommodation:** Hampton Inn, Halifax-Downtown (3 nights).

June 30 After breakfast, a local guide will take us on a tour of the city, including various points of interest. We will then drive to picturesque Peggy's Cove for lunch and some free time to explore this charming village. Upon our return to the city, we will enjoy a memorable performance of the Royal Nova Scotia International Tattoo. Arguably Canada's best kept entertainment secret, it has been referred to as "a circus with bagpipes". (B/L/-)

July 1 Enjoy free time to explore the city on Canada Day! Options include watching a parade, featuring participants of the Tattoo and which concludes right outside our hotel. Nearby is the historic Citadel which has free admission and spectacular views of the city and harbour. Enjoy wandering along the waterfront which features buskers, live music and free entry to naval ships and special attractions. You may also choose to take a fun-filled tour of Alexander Keith's original brewery, founded in 1820 (a group tour may be arranged if there is sufficient interest). Nearby is the Maritime Museum of the Atlantic which houses exhibits explaining the city's great explosion and fire of 1917, as well as relics from the Titanic. Although there are many choices throughout the day, we can all celebrate Canada's 155^{th} birthday together in the evening, by watching the sky erupt in a blaze of colourful fireworks. **(B/-/-)**

July 2 Today we will visit the newly renovated Pier 21 Immigration Museum which tells the story of immigrants who entered at this very place and who have contributed to making Canada one of the world's most desired places to live. There will also be time to stroll through the adjacent Halifax Seaport Farmers' Market for a snack and some last-minute shopping, before we are transferred to the airport for our return flight. (B/-/-)

NEWFOUNDLAND: July 7-15, 2022 Escorts: Earl Clint & John Swatridge

July 7 We depart Toronto on a morning flight, bound for Deer Lake. Upon arrival, we will drive to Corner Brook, the province's second largest city and take in the scenic view from Captain Cook's Lookout, before checking into our historic hotel. (-/-/D) Accommodation: The Glynmill Inn, Corner Brook.

July 8 In Woody Point we will learn about the geology of the Tablelands, part of Gros Morne National Park. When the continents collided, rocks which were beneath the ocean were pushed upwards to their present position above sea level. A boat tour on Bonne Bay will provide closer views of the steep cliffs and possible sightings of eagles and whales. Enjoy dinner and a live show at our hotel tonight. (B/L/D) Accommodation: Shallow Bay Motel, Cow Head.

July 9 Today we visit L'Anse aux Meadows, a United Nations World Heritage Site, where Vikings settled over one thousand years ago. In St. Anthony we will board a vessel to learn about the delicate marine ecology and to perhaps see both whales and icebergs. These imposing blocks of ice which have broken off the continental glaciers, have drifted south propelled by the Labrador Current. Amazingly, 90% of the ice is below the surface of the water. <u>Note</u>: If conditions are not favourable, another boat tour may be arranged in Twillingate. **(B/L/-) Accommodation:** Haven Inn, St. Anthony.

July 10 Our day begins with a visit to a museum honouring Sir Wilfred Grenfell, a medical missionary who devoted his life's work to the people of Northern Newfoundland and Labrador. We then begin our southward journey, viewing the rugged coastal scenery with a few stops along the way. Local entertainment will be provided by our hotel after dinner this evening. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Mount Peyton Hotel, Grand Falls-Windsor.

July 11 Today at Boyd's Cove Beothuk Interpretation Site, we will learn about the Indigenous Peoples who once lived here, then have a picnic lunch on the grounds (weather permitting). At the Prime Berth Fishing Exhibit, we will come to better understand the traditional way of life in the province's rural outports. In Twillingate, options include a boat tour (see above), or a winery visit. After a drive to the local lighthouse, perched on rugged cliffs, we will enjoy food, music, and humour at the Twillingate Dinner Theatre. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Anchor Inn, Alphabet Fleet Inn and others in Twillingate.

July 12 Our first stop today will be at the North Atlantic Aviation Museum in Gander. The city has a proud history connected to trans-Atlantic aviation crossings, and the airport played a crucial role on Sept. 11, 2001. We then drive to the Ryan Premises in Bonavista to visit a historic fish merchant operation, then to the famous lighthouse near the spot where John Cabot landed in 1497. This evening we will experience a traditional "Screech-In", in which participants are inducted into the ranks of "Honourary Newfoundlanders". **(B/-/D) Accommodation:** The Clarenville Inn, Clarenville.


July 13 Our main focus today is Cape St. Mary's Ecological Reserve at the southern tip of the Avalon Peninsula (conditions permitting), one of the continent's largest bird colonies. Watch in amazement as thousands of seabirds take flight all around us, including gannets, kittiwakes and murres. This evening you can relax at the hotel or head downtown to enjoy some traditional music at one of the numerous establishments on George Street. (B/L/-) Accommodation: Holiday Inn, St. John's (2 nights).

July 14 We begin the day with a guided tour of St. John's including Signal Hill, Quidi Vidi Village and many other historic sites. After some free-time downtown, we head to Bay Bulls for a boat tour of Witless Bay Ecological Reserve, home to puffins and other seabirds, as well as humpback whales. Prepare to be amazed if one of these giants swim close to our boat. This evening we will enjoy good food, comedy and song, at a "Spirit of Newfoundland" production. **(B/-/D)**

July 15 This morning we will visit the Johnson Geo Centre which is built into Signal Hill. Here you can relive the Titanic story in a detailed permanent gallery, see displays which explain how the offshore Hibernia oil reserves are recovered and view exhibits on the province's unique geology. After some free time for lunch downtown, we will visit Petty Harbour and Cape Spear, the most easterly point in North America, before transferring to the airport for our return flight. (B/-/-)

<u>NEWFOUNDLAND REVISITED</u>: August 24-31, 2022 Escorts: Earl Clint & John Swatridge

August 24 We depart Toronto on an early afternoon flight to St. John's where upon arrival, we will check into our hotel. You may want to relax and eat at the on-site restaurant, or you may choose to go downtown for dinner and some live music on George Street. **Accommodation:** Holiday Inn, St. John's (2 nights).

August 25 This morning we will take in the view from Signal Hill and then be given a few options. You can either visit the Johnson Geo Centre (see description above) or The Rooms, Newfoundland and Labrador's largest public cultural space, where the province's history, heritage and art are on display and explained. After some free-time for lunch downtown, we head to Bay Bulls for a boat tour featuring rugged coastal scenery and Witless Bay Ecological Reserve, home to puffins and other seabirds. This evening we will enjoy great food, music and humour at a "Spirit of Newfoundland" dinner theatre production. (B/-/D)

August 26 Today we will enjoy a scenic drive through various coastal towns including Harbour Grace, Carbonear, Heart's Content, Heart's Desire and Heart's Delight, with a few interesting stops along the way. After dinner we will enjoy some local entertainment at our hotel. (B/L/D) Accommodation: The Clarenville Inn, Clarenville.

August 27 Our first stop is the historic town of Trinity which contains a number of buildings recognized by the Heritage Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador. Discovered in 1501 by the Portuguese, it was used as a summer fishing port by the British and later, a permanent settlement was established in the early 1700's. This scenic location has been featured in several documentaries and movies including "The Shipping News" and "Random Passage". After a walking tour, some free time will be given for lunch. We then visit Elliston, the "Root Cellar Capital of the World" and the closest place to view puffins on land anywhere in the world. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Sinbad's Hotel, Gander (2 nights).

August 28 This morning we head to Farewell where we will board a ferry to Fogo Island. Here we will be met by a local guide who will take us on a scenic tour including several points of interest such as Brimstone Head, a piece of rocky landscape jutting into the sky. According to the "Flat Earth Society", this is one of the four corners of the earth! We will stop at the award-winning Fogo Island Inn, a sleek, Nordic-style hotel perched on stilts at the ocean's edge and also visit the town of Tilting, first settled by the Irish in the 18th century and now a National Historic Site. (B/L/D)

August 29 Today we will visit the Salmonid Interpretation Centre in Grand Falls-Windsor where staff will inform us about salmon conservation efforts in the central region of the province. After lunch, we will make several scenic photo stops on our way through the mountains of Gros Morne National Park. In Rocky Harbour, we will visit the Gros Morne Wildlife Museum before checking into our hotel. After dinner, we will enjoy an evening of on-site entertainment provided by "Anchors Aweigh", a talented and very funny group of local musicians. **(B/-/D) Accommodation:** Ocean View Hotel, Rocky Harbour (2 nights).

August 30 We begin the day with a visit to Lobster Head Cove Lighthouse where an interpreter will give us an overview of Gros Morne National Park before we drive north to Western Brook Pond. Today the group will be divided into two, depending on which boat tour you have pre-selected (you will be contacted one month prior to the trip). *Please look at the Bontours website for more information, but the following may also be helpful.* The Western Brook Pond boat tour offers spectacular views of this glacial carved land-locked fjord, with 650 metre cliffs and cascading waterfalls. *Please note: this tour requires walking a gentle 3 km well groomed gravel trail from the parking lot to the dock (and of course 3 km back).* The other choice is the Bonne Bay

boat tour which requires very little walking and allows views of The Tablelands in the southern part of the park (as described above). In either case there will be time for lunch at dockside restaurants prior to your chosen tour. We will come back together at the hotel, for our farewell dinner and an evening of traditional music and fun at a "Newfoundland Kitchen Party", featuring local musician David Shears. (B/-/D)

August 31 We enjoy one last scenic drive through the park, before stopping at the Newfoundland Insectarium which also has a butterfly garden. We then transfer to the Deer Lake airport for our afternoon flight. (B/-/-)

<u>Important</u>: At the time of writing (subject to change), travellers to Portugal will be required to present a negative Covid-19 antigen test taken within 48 hours of boarding and be in possession of a digital vaccine certificate. Passengers returning to Canada must present a negative Covid-19 PCR test, taken within 72 hours of boarding their flight (this will be arranged at extra cost) and complete a Canada Health Attestation form. You must also download the ArriveCan app. prior to the tour.

September 22 This evening we will depart Toronto on an overnight flight to Lisbon, with on-board meal service included.

September 23 Upon arrival, we will be met by our local tour guide who will lead us on an overview of the scenic and colourful Portuguese capital, built on seven hills. After seeing some of Lisbon's most well-known sights, we will check into our hotel and enjoy dinner together. (-/-/D) Accommodation: Hotel Holiday Inn Lisbon Continental, Lisbon (4*), or similar (2 nights).

September 24 Today's city tour features the country's maritime heritage, acknowledging those who set off from here to discover the "New World". We will see the iconic *UNESCO listed *Belem Tower, and the *Hieronymite Monastery, an example of 15th-century Manueline architecture. This evening, explore the area near our centrally located hotel. (B/-/-)

September 25 Today we drive south towards the Serra da Arrabida Mountains, through the golden pastures of the Alentejo region with its medieval cities and Roman ruins. We will have lunch at a stud ranch, where Lusitano horses have been reared, dating back to the 18th century. We continue on to the Algarve region which boasts having over 300 days of sunshine per year! (B/L/-) Accommodation: Hotel Vila Gale Ampalius, Quarteira (4*), or similar (2 nights).

September 26 Our drive through the Sagres Peninsula will provide stunning views of rugged cliffs, beautiful coastal views including Baleeira Beach and the barren headlands of Cape St. Vincent, Europe's most southwestern point. We will stop in the seaside town of Lagos, once the home of Henry the Navigator, before returning to our hotel. (B/-/-)

September 27 Today we travel across the Serra do Caldeirao Mountains to the historic city of *Evora. Here we will have a guided tour of the medieval cathedral, Roman temple and the famous Chapel of Bones. Free time will then be given to explore the city's medieval history with enough time to relax in the Praça do Giraldo, the main public square. This evening we will have dinner together. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Hotel Vila Galé, Evora (4*), or similar.

September 28 Our first stop is hilltop town of Castelo de Vide with its dazzling white houses and flower lined alleyways. After driving through the Serra de Estrela mountains, we arrive in Viseu. The city offers panoramic views of the Dao region, which is famous for its red wines. The city's 13th-century cathedral, is a dominant landmark and there are many public gardens, squares and fountains to enjoy. (B/-/-) Accommodation: Montebelo Viseu Congress Hotel (4*), or similar.

September 29 Dramatic vistas highlight our journey today through the *Douro Valley, where fine wines are produced from grapes grown on sloping vineyards. We will stop at the Quinta de Marrocos winery (or similar), then visit the beautiful gardens at the Baroque-style Palacio de Mateus, depicted on the label of Mateus wine bottles. Next is the town of Guimaraes, known for its

labyrinth of laneways and for its impressive *Guimaraes Cathedral and 10th-century castle. We continue on to Porto, the country's second largest city. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Hotel Eurostar Heroismo, Porto (4*), or similar (2 nights).

September 30 Our guided tour of the historic Porto town centre and the *Ribeira District will feature winding cobblestone lanes and the Sao Francisco Baroque church. We will visit the Stock Exchange Palace with its splendid Arabian Hall, and we will learn about the centuries-old tradition of port production (and of course have a sample or two). There will also be free time to eat, shop and to admire the colourful buildings with azulejo-clad facades (glazed ceramic tiles). You may also enjoy strolling along the Cais de Ribeira, a promenade adjacent to the Douro River. (B/-/-)

October 1 At *Coimbra University, one of Europe's oldest, Baroque architecture is on dazzling display, especially in its famous library (entry subject to availability). In Tomar we will visit the *Convento de Cristo (Convent of Christ), built as a Templar stronghold in the 12th century. **(B/-/D) Accommodation:** Hotel Aurea, Fátima (4*), or similar.

October 2 In Fatima we will visit the pilgrimage site where three young shepherds reported seeing an apparition of the Virgin Mary in 1917. After visiting the impressive *Batalha Abbey, we drive to Nazare which is famous for its massive surfing waves (among the world's largest), which crash into a scenic cliff-backed beach. Next is Obidos, a medieval walled city with quaint whitewashed houses, cobblestone roads and an imposing castle. (B/-/-) Accommodation: Hotel Praia d'el Rei Marriott Golf & Beach Resort (4*) or similar.

October 3 Today we will visit Mafra and *Sintra, a fairy-tale town of whimsical palaces and beautiful gardens (includes entry to the lavish National Palaces of Sintra and Pena). Tonight, enjoy a farewell Portuguese Fado evening of traditional food, music and dance. (B/-/D) Accommodation: Hotel Holiday Inn Lisbon Continental, Lisbon (4*), or similar.

October 4 Today marks the end of this unforgettable Portuguese holiday. After breakfast we will be transferred to the airport for our return flight to Toronto (in-flight meals included). (B/-/-)

Accommodation: When completing the registration form, please specify the type of accommodation that you require and ensure the correct price is entered. Any damage done to public or private property while on the tour will be the responsibility of the person who causes the damage. Laundry facilities are available at many of the hotels.
